The Peace Chamber Music Workshop welcomes applications from college-aged and adult professionals, accomplished non-professionals and existing chamber music ensembles. Participants who are not members of existing or pre-formed ensembles will be assigned to ensembles. In consultation with the participants, coaches will assign pieces to each ensemble, and the ensembles will perform the works, or portions of them, in concert at the Peace Center at the end of the workshop period.
