Mochrie's first appearance on “Whose Line Is It Anyway,” the British version, was in 1991. His role on the American “Whose Line” got off to a rocky start when ABC wanted to drop Mochrie because they thought the comedian looked too old and not hip enough. Thankfully those involved in the show held their ground, and ABC was smart enough to see that talent and creativity were more important than 'hip' and the fans agreed, making Mochrie a popular mainstay on the American “Whose Line” stage.

Brad Sherwood was a regular cast member on ABC's “Whose Line Is It Anyway?” as well on the British version on Comedy Central as well and will be seen on the second upcoming season of the new “Whose Line Is It Anyway?” on The CW. His credits include “The Drew Carey Show,” “The Green Screen Show,” over 100 appearances on “The Tonight Show with Jay Leno,” numerous appearances on VH-1's “I Love The 80's' & 90's,” “The Price is Right” and guest hosting “Talk Soup.”
